



**TRINITY THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, PERTH
PART-TIME LECTURER IN MISSIONS (0.4-0.6FTE)**

Trinity Theological College (TTC), Perth, Western Australia, seeks to appoint a Part-Time Lecturer in Missions (0.4-0.6FTE) from January 2021 to initiate, oversee, and participate in teaching, mentoring, and preparing our students for cross-cultural missions contexts and in general cultural awareness for ministry. This is a new position on our faculty. Salary and benefits will follow our academic staff salary bands with consideration of previous experience and final responsibilities. Workdays are negotiable.

Trinity is an independent college in the evangelical, Reformed tradition with 90 enrolled students and over 300 graduates. Our mission is to “prepare people for effective Christian service” through teaching, preaching, and serving the gospel of Christ in a variety of local, regional, and international communities and contexts. Trinity is an affiliated college of the Australian College of Theology (ACT).

Position Goals

1. **Headline Task:** To ensure all graduates of TTC degree courses are prepared to begin an effective gospel ministry in a variety of cultural settings, with a particular focus on cross-cultural contexts.
2. **Teaching and Learning:** To prepare and deliver engaging, high-quality lectures/tutorials, provide prompt and pertinent assessment feedback for ACT and TTC units in Evangelism and Mission (EM), and possibly other Ministry and Practice units; to develop library and other resources to support this teaching and learning.
3. **Advising:** To provide pastoral, academic, and missions advice to students as needed.
4. **Training and mentoring:** To assist in establishing and monitoring a church- and/or missions-based mentoring programme for students.
5. **Relationship management:** To develop and deepen formal and informal relationships for the College with missions agencies (including Missions Interlink) and churches to: ensure regular communication and two-way feedback; raise the profile of cross-cultural missions and training for it; and enhance student learning and experience. This may include occasional speaking, teaching, and consultation opportunities (including Sundays).
6. **Other faculty responsibilities as required:** chapel participation, event involvement (commencement and graduation, information nights, etc.); attendance and contribution to faculty meetings as needed; occasional College deputation; and occasional teaching in the Certificate of Christian Studies course.

Selection Criteria

1. Wholehearted support of the College’s purpose, beliefs, and training model (see <https://ttc.wa.edu.au/about/why-trinity/>).
2. Mature and active Christian faith, Christ-like character, a burden for the lost, and a pastoral heart.
3. Clear evangelical and Reformed theological and ministry convictions; a practical commitment to biblical theology and expository preaching.
4. Academic qualifications including an MDiv (or equivalent) and a completed or well-progressed doctoral degree to enable registration as an ACT lecturer in EM (essential) and PC/DM (desirable) areas to masters level.

5. Seven years' recent, continuous experience in cross-cultural missions, with at least three years in teams and/or field leadership.
6. Recognised evangelistic, teaching, mentoring, and pastoral gifts. Previous experience and leadership in education contexts an advantage.
7. Strong administration and communication abilities; evidence of strategic and collaborative leadership.
8. Excellent networking and people-management skills.
